building more than just homes

Habitat for Humanity GTA builds more than just homes. We build communities. For Habitat homeowners, the homes we build are a sanctuary where parents feel safe raising their children. It is a welcoming place where families are comfortable having friends and family members over. It is the foundation for children to grow into the best version of themselves – today, tomorrow and for years to come. Every home that donors, volunteers and supporters like you help us build, is not just a home for a family, it forms the underpinnings of a better community for everyone.

In 2018, we provided 28 families with the strength, stability and self-reliance of affordable homeownership. That is 142 people and 88 more children that now have a safe and decent place to call home, and a community to thrive in.

Each new Habitat community begins with empty land, and a diverse group of people coming together to build, and give families a hand-up. But they end with new friendships, shared bonds and a sense of belonging by the time the homes are complete. This is the type of community we envision at Habitat for Humanity GTA, which comes to life through the Habitat model.

As you read the report, you will learn about the communities individuals are building through their involvement with us. Both in the physical sense and for themselves. It is a community of thousands of people who donated to our builds, volunteered their time and partnered with us to become Habitat homeowners in 2018.

Together, we are building stronger communities for everyone throughout the GTA. Communities where citizens, and public, private and nonprofit sectors work alongside each other, and take action for the right to access decent, affordable housing for all its residents.

We would like to extend to each of you our sincere gratitude for the community you are helping us build. We hope you share our excitement and continue to get behind the vision of the GTA we're building together.



VISION


A world where everyone has a safe and decent place to live.

Welcome Home Ceremonies: a community is born

There is no better feeling than putting a key in the hand of a Habitat homeowner, and welcoming the family into their new home. A Welcome Home Ceremony is a moment in time when our community comes together to acknowledge and celebrate the hard work families put in to become Habitat homeowners.

In 2018, we hosted four Welcome Home Ceremonies. We welcomed families home at our Kennedy Road build in the Town of Caledon, Pinery Trail build in Scarborough, at our McLaughlin Road build in Brampton, and at Beckonrose, a Daniels FirstHome[™] in Brampton. It was inspiring to bring together our community of donors and volunteers that helped build these homes, and government partners who make our work possible.



Habitat homeownership: a new community of families

Homeownership represents new opportunities for the 28 partner families that became Habitat homeowners in 2018. It represents the opportunity for housing stability. It represents comfort and safety, and the ability to start investing in themselves and their children's futures. It also represents the opportunity to feel a part of a community.

From the moment our partner families met for the first time at their homeowner information sessions, they started to form new friendships. Our staff and volunteers witnessed families bonding over becoming neighbours, having children the same age and sharing how they plan to do their 500 hours of sweat equity. The friendships strengthened as they volunteered together on the build sites and at ReStores.

It goes to show that the communities we are building through the Habitat model are more than just rows of homes. Together, we are helping build new networks of relationships that will last a lifetime.

family builds community on the build site

When Amreet and Devi moved into their Habitat home at McLaughlin Road in Brampton, they were relieved to finally have a decent place to live and raise their children. But they never imagined the sense of belonging and community they would build by becoming Habitat homeowners.

The family of four previously lived in the basement of a townhouse. Their living space was a converted bedroom, no bigger than $10' \times 12'$. At the time, much of their energy was pre-consumed with coping and making do in their tight living quarters. But since becoming Habitat homeowners, a lot has changed.

"My family and I have become close with our new neighbours, the build site staff and volunteers," says Amreet, the father of the family. "Our son and daughter play with the children next door, and I have had the chance to get to know and spend quality time with the Habitat community – staff, Habitat homeowners and the volunteers that helped build our home.

Amreet works night shifts at his job six days a week. On his day off, he can be found preparing lunches for the families and volunteers on the build site, and spending time in his home with his family and neighbours.

My family and I have become close with our new neighbours, the build site staff and volunteers.




building community through volunteerism

Habitat for Humanity GTA is powered by volunteers. But what often goes unnoticed is the community people build for themselves through their volunteer experience. There are many stories of friendships and bonds that began and flourished through volunteering. Whether giving time on our build sites, at our ReStores, offices or events, these stories continue to inspire us.

More than 7,500 people generously gave their time and labour to lend us a helping hand in 2018. That is over 155,000 volunteer hours that we graciously received from the community. And it is their shared sense of purpose and belonging that fuels the communities we are building.

In 2018, our volunteer community of retirees, students, company employees and community groups gave back with their time in a number of ways. On the build site, volunteer Crew and Crew Leaders came out six days a week, year-round, to build and work alongside groups. Company employees took time out of their busy schedules to help lend a hand. At our ReStores, volunteers helped coordinate, receive, and organize donations from the community and spent time together deconstructing cabinetry and vanities for donors.

We'd like to extend a sincere thank you to everyone who contributed their time, talent and hard work to building communities in 2018.

building skills and confidence on the build site: Lovleen's story

Lovleen is proud to be a woman in the trades. She got her start in construction as a co-op student working on a Habitat build site. Looking back on her journey, she never thought that the shy high school version of herself would blossom into the outgoing woman she is today.

"When I came onto the build site for the first day of my co-op, I was very nervous," says Lovleen. "I only ever interacted with friends my own age before, and now I had to get to know and work alongside older volunteers from different backgrounds."

Over the course of the first year of her co-op, Lovleen started to come out of her shell. She learned new skills from build site staff and volunteers, which she carries with her to this day. She even started leading volunteer groups, and credits the experience to improving her confidence.

"I really learned a lot from the volunteers on the build site," says Lovleen. "Not only construction based skills, but social skills that have made me a better communicator, and have helped me get along with people of all types."

Even though many of the regular Crew and Crew Leader volunteers are more than twice her age, she developed friendships and strong bonds that continue to mean a lot to her.

"The Crew, Crew Leaders and build site staff have become like family to me," says Lovleen. "I have been to Christmas parties at their homes, and go to the build sites on weekends at times, even after my coop, to catch up, laugh and share stories with my friends."

Lovleen found her community and passion for construction on the build site. She now works as a carpenter apprentice, and is one of the only females in the program.

The focus of Habitat ReStore in 2018 was to strengthen community connections. In doing so, we opened new ReStores in Woodbridge and Markham to better serve our communities, and reopened our old store in Vaughan at a new location that is more accessible to residents.

Our team also went above and beyond to attend local events, farmers' markets and trade shows to better understand and engage the communities we serve.

We ended the year with 12 ReStore locations across the GTA, which collected more than 12,000 donations of product, conducted 239 home deconstruction visits and earned \$7,181,000 in sales to help us build more homes.

We were honoured to be joined by political dignitaries, community members and volunteers for the grand openings of our Woodbridge and Markham East ReStores in 2018. The community support we received made it possible.
